2006 NAYRC Information Now Available

The USDF is pleased to announce that the 2006 North American Young Rider's Championships (NAYRC) Qualifying Criteria and Selection Procedures for dressage competitors are now available. All riders interested in qualifying for the 2006 NAYRC should obtain a copy of this information. Included in the procedures is information on how to declare your intent to qualify for this event. A rider's declaration of intent to qualify for the NAYRC is due to USDF by March 1, 2006.

The NAYRC is the premier competition for young riders, ages 16-21, in the three Olympic equestrian disciplines of eventing, dressage and show jumping. Riders are invited to compete from each province of Canada, U. S. Equestrian zone (for show jumping), USDF Region (for dressage) and United States Eventing Association area (for eventing), as well as from Mexico, Central America, the Caribbean Islands, and Bermuda via each country's national equestrian federation. The broad range of competitors attending the championships produces an Olympic-like atmosphere. The 2006 NAYRC will be held at the Virginia Horse Center in Lexington, VA, August 1-6. USDF Convention Basket Won

As in the past, FWDC sent a basket to the annual convention held in Los Angeles in December. Ours was one of the 37 total baskets contributed by GMOs from all over the country. This year our basket was won by Barbara Cadwell. Unfortunately, no other information was given as to where Barbara is from or what part of dressage she is involved in but we hope that she enjoys the goodies FWDC sent.

Is Your Horse in Pain?

I recently received an article from Cynthia Collins of Luna Tunes Freestyles discussing her experiences with horses with ulcers and TMJ problems, which can seriously effect their desire to work and to perform at their best. Space limits my using her every word and I will have to break up the information to get all of it to you. Let's deal with ulcers first.

Horses have ulcers. Vet studies estimate that 60% of all performance horses have them. Up to 57% of foals have stomach ulcers in their first few months of life. Recent vet studies show that they can develop in as little as 5 days in horses exposed to recreational show conditions and activities.

Prevention would seem the goal and there are three ways to reduce the risk. Firstly, lessen the production of stomach acid over the day. Three products can help: Cimetidine (generic Tagamet) Ranitidine (generic Zantac) or Omeprazole (generic Prilosec). The second part is to absorb acid and coat the upper 1/3rd of the stomach. For this use Tums, Maalox, Mylanta, U-Gard or Neigh-Lox. These work instantly to help reduce pain so the horses make the connection quickly and relax. The third part is to make sure that there is food in the stomach when the horse is exercised. That minimizes the potential for ulcers in the upper part of the stomach. Simply feed your horse a few cups of hay pellets right before exercise. Many people believe that the use of herbs and aloe vera can help the healing process too.

Hind gut ulcers can be a problem in addition to gastric ulcers. But, medication designed to work on stomach ulcers just don't provide relief or treatment in the colon. Probiotics and oat fiber added to the diet usually take care of these. Suggested prevention/cures also are hay and turnout 24/7 and reduced stress. In all of this, keep your vet involved as he can often order bulk drugs at a reduced rate if needed.

Book Review....101 Dressage Exercises for Horse & Rider

You can't just go to a horse show without looking at all the vendor booths so, in Houston I took time before we left to do just that. The Forest Horse booth specialized in books and gifts. I was drawn to a largish spiral bound book with the above title. It is written by Jec Artistotle Ballou and has a foreward by Olympic Medalist Lisa Wilcox. I liked what I saw very much. So much in fact, I bought one for myself and ordered three copies for gifts for friends!

The contents page is divided into groups from warm-up to the importance of fitness. Under each category, there is a list of specific exercises.

The text of the book is clean and easy to read with each exercise illustrated with both diagrams, illustrations and/or photographs as well as written informa-

tion. The text explains how the exercise is ridden, notes to keep in mind while riding and the importance and function of what the exercise can do for the horse and rider.

Clearly well thought out, the spiral format with a hanging hole at the top allows a rider to take the book to the arena and either hang it or prop it where it can be used while doing the exercises. I can't remember all of them and I'll bet you can't either! This is probably the most practical and useful dressage book I've ever bought and well worth the \$29.95 price.


